What Are Advanced Placement[®] Courses?









Advanced Placement[®]: The Basics

- AP[®] courses are college-level courses offered in high school
- Courses reflect what is taught in top introductory college courses
- Students take AP Exams at the end of the course, measuring their mastery of college-level work
- A score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam can typically earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college



Our AP[®] Courses

- English: English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition
- History and Social Sciences: Macroeconomics, Psychology, United States Government and Politics, United States History, World History, Human Geography (GTHS only)
- Mathematics and Computer Science: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Computer Science A, Statistics



Our AP[®] Courses

- **Sciences:** Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science(CHS only), Physics 1: Algebra-based,
- World languages: Spanish Language and Culture, Spanish Literature and Culture, German Language and Culture(BHS only), German Language and Culture(BHS only)
 - Visual and Performing Arts: Studio Art (BHS only)

AP[®] Helps Students Graduate on Time & Save Money

- Students who take AP courses and exams are much more likely to complete a college degree on time.* Graduating in four years represents a significant savings on the cost of college.
- Only 1 in 4 college students completes a bachelor's degree in 4 years.
- The average cost of college for a single year is \$23,410** for in-state schools (tuition, fees, room/board, misc. expenses).

AP[®] Exams

AP Exams are administered by schools worldwide on set dates in May each year.

- Exams are typically 2–3 hours and include:
 - Multiple-choice questions
 - Free-response items such as essays, problem solving, document-based questions and oral response









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AP[®] Exams 20/21 Update

Each of the 38 exams has its own unique requirements; however, almost all of the exams have several things in common:


- Most exams are 2–3 hours long.
- The first part of the exam usually consists of multiple-choice questions.
 - You will choose 1 of 4–5 answer choices for each question and use a pencil to bubble in your choice on your AP answer sheet.
 - Your total exam score on the multiple-choice section is based only on the number of questions answered correctly. You won't receive or lose points for incorrect answers or unanswered questions.
- The second part of the exam usually consists of free-response questions that require you to generate your own responses. Depending on the exam, your responses could be in the form of an essay, a solution to a problem, or a spoken response. In most cases, you'll be writing your response in pen in the free-response exam booklet.

Exam Requirements

Students must do some test preparation in order to take the exam free of charge:

- Enrolled in an AP Course
- Finish Exam Prep Course must meet with the Assistant Principal and submit 50 hours of practice in a log




Step one: "JOIN" myAP course

AP[®] Exam Fees

AP 2021 Exams

The 2021 exams will cover the full content in each course, so students have the opportunity to receive college credit and placement.



Given the uncertainties of the 2020-21 school year, some students may feel unsure about taking AP Exams in May. So that students feel comfortable registering by the fall deadline, **this year there will be no fees whatsoever if a student decides not to test or to cancel their exams.** Every AP student should keep their options open by registering for the exam on time because there will still be a \$40 fee for late orders.

The AP Program will support in-school testing in 2021 because administering exams in schools maximizes access and opportunity. If safety concerns still prohibit any students from testing at a school, we will provide a contingency testing option that contains full course content.

Preparation for Exams

Instructions

Start in your AP class.

Ask your AP teacher to go over the exam format with you in class, if they haven't done so already.

Ask your teacher about the practice resources in AP Classroom.

AP Classroom is a suite of digital tools that teachers can use throughout the year to help you prepare for the AP Exam. The tools include personal progress checks with multiple-choice and free-response questions your teacher can unlock for you to receive personalized feedback on the skills and topics you're learning in the course. Your teacher may also assign AP practice or released exam questions using the AP Question Bank.

New for 2020-21: **AP Daily** videos are short, targeted videos that you can watch to help support your learning for each topic within a course unit. Starting in September, you can access AP Daily videos through AP Classroom.

Practice in AP Classroom

Enrolled in an AP course? If you've already joined your class section online, your teacher can assign you practice questions through AP Classroom. Sign in to access them.
