Paul J. Rogers to Receive Doctor of Education Degree

COLTON — Paul J. Rogers, superintendent of the Colton Elementary School District, will receive a doctor of education degree at commencement exercises this afternoon at the University of Southern California.

The exercises are scheduled for 1:45 p.m.

Rogers' dissertation was entitled "Development and Utilization of Elementary School Sites."

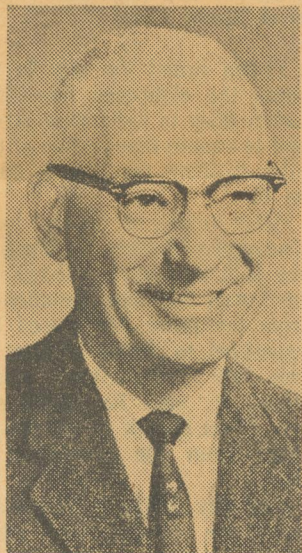
Rogers has been with the Colton Elementary School District since 1939, when he was named a principal. In 1944 he was named district superintendent.

A native of Downey, Rogers graduated in 1922 from Porterville Union High School, Porterville. He received his BA degree from California Christian College, Los Angeles, in 1927.

From 1929 to 1936 he was an elementary teacher in Westmorland School District, Westmorland. The next year he was an elementary teacher at Holtville School District, Holtville.

From 1937 to 1939 he was a teaching principal at Fairfax School District, Bakersfield.

Rogers received his MS in education from the University of Southern California in 1953.
